As a child Neoma remembers those days;


When joy was to play with toy and video games






Season of harvesting has arrived;

Their eyes are sparkling with joy;


As they see their little crops Turn into grains, fruits and plants that will fill the hungry men, women, girls and boys

When their grown crops are eaten by the country or exported




A good meal at home is what we relish; Behind it, is the effort of the various farmers in embellish

The concept of the author is to write rhyming stories for children, as it helps them learn English in a fun way. Every rhyming story helps the child focus on the important values and habits that must be inculcated in them.

The joy of sharing and caring with others is highlighted in this story. Along with this, the author has focused on the importance of having gratitude in life and being happy, kind and humble in every situation

The first 6 lines explain the excitement of birthdays that a child feels which includes gifts, cakes, parties and fun

Lines 7-10: focuses on the importance of being caring and loving towards the others. All children love getting presents but they should also learn how to give them.

Lines 11-14: explain that importance of gratitude in life. Though the kids were blind and couldn't see yet they were Smiling, happy, thankful and polite

Lines 15-18: focus on being satisfied and happy in life. Many small and big problems come in life but

FRIENDSHIP

The story elaborates on friendship between 2 boys coming from different backgrounds. The author wants to emphasis the importance of pure friendship irrespective of the backgrounds. The feelings and care for each human is the same and kids are of pure innocence.

The first 4 lines: show 2 boys playing in the garden

Lines 5-6: show that Rahul could afford shoes, where as Shyam couldn't

Lines 7-8: show them playing hide and seek,





one should find solutions or be happy in the situation rather than complaining. The blind kids can't see but they didn't complain, they imagined the world colourful like their dreams

Lines 19-20: explains the importance of being confident in every situation. It's important to have will power and not give up in any situation. For eg. the blind children inspite of not being able to see, they studied with full dedication to make a bright future for themselves.

Lines 21-26: explain an important lesson taught by Neoma's mother. She explains to her child that one should always respect everyone, be humble but at the same time confident and bold. She also taught neoma to have a thanking and a blessed attitude in life

chatting and enjoying themselves

Lines9-14: as evening approached and it became cold, Rahul was well clad and enjoying but Shyam didn't have proper clothes and was shivering.in spite of different clothes, their heart felt the same emotion and friendship

Lines15-24: show them enjoying the rainy and the boys chasing the balloon and bidding each other goodbye

Lines 25-35: shows sharing in the friendship. Rahul noticed his friend shivering so got him warm clothes and in return Shyam gifted him a bunch of flowers plucked from the park. Though both are from different backgrounds yet their heart is pure and they shared with each other what they could get.sharing and caring is very important in friendship and a pure friendship can last a life time

DON'T WASTE FOOD

The story explains the entire process of farming from the time the farmers sow the crop till they harvest it. It's months of hard work of the farmers that go into growing vegetables and fruits, thus the importance of not wasting food is highlighted

The first 4 lines: explain the excitement of the farmers during the harvesting season, after months of sowing and watering the seeds, they get excited to see the crops that have grown in fruits and vegetables

Lines 5-8- explain the hardwork of the farmers before harvesting the crop. They need to sow the right crops (based on the type of soil and type of season they live in), water in correct quantities many times of the day

Lines 9-10: explain that the government of India has set up a special department of agriculture which provides timely information of the crop to the farmers. Also it provided information on pesticides, fertiliser, multures to farmers and give them certain products at discounted rates (subsidied rates)

Farmers have to travel to offices to get this information

Fertiliser are sprays that help the crop grow by providing it with right kind of nutrition

Pesticides are sprays which protects crops from pests (type of insects) who eat and finish them off

Lines 11-14: every fruit and vegetable have a different kind of storage post harvesting

Grains are usually dried and can be stored for a longer time while vegetables and fruits and put in cartons and quickly transported so the general public get them fresh

Line 15-16: after a long travel, they reach people through markets and stalls

Lines 17-18: most of the grains, fruits and vegetables are consumed by the people of the country and a certain percentage is exported to other countries so the people staying in that country can also enjoy eating the products

Lines 19-26: explains the importance of eating slowly and enjoying every meal. Behind every meal is hardwork of the farmers and one should be thankful that we get food to eat. Leftovers in plate is wasting all the effort and time of the farmers. Instead of throwing leftover in dustbins, one should take little quantity in plate and finish meal and the extra should be distributed to the needy. It's important to respect the food we eat
